scan ordinary drivers — usually without a warrant.

- 11 cameras in Crossville (Atlas of Surveillance, Sept. 2025)
- ~\$25,000/yr proposed in Quote Q-00234 (confirm invoices)
- As of July 2026: no official public map or search policy found
- Documented Flock personal-use conviction in Oak Ridge, TN

What to say / text to a neighbor
